Welcome to our meet the members section!

This is a chance to put names to faces, and an opportunity to identify who to hit up for that extra pearl of sailing wisdom!

This week we feature our previously faithful publicity scribe, all round fabulously helpful and friendly gentleman, and BYRA Club Patron - Robb Warnes!

Robb, how did you get into sailing?

Through my family and my father. He was in the Royal Navy reserve and was stationed on a mine sweeper in WW2. We had an Enterprise dinghy in Norfolk. When I was 15, I was sent to the Isle of Wight for sail training. We sailed on an 18' boat with about six people in it. I remember the oil skins!

What sorts of sailing have you done?

Lots of keel boat sailing on the west coast of Scotland and racing out of Helensbrough Sailing Club and Largs Sailing Club, both on the Cldye River close to Glasgow. I was Commodore of Largs and Rear Commodore of Helensborough. The Cyde is also where the British Royal Navy's fleet of nuclear submarines is based, and we had to give way to them during racing!

I used to crew on the Scottish series also - the first race was an overnighter that went around the Mull of Kintyre and up to Oban on the east coast. Although it was in May it's still so cold in Scotland so we had to keep ourselves warm with some *Uisge Beath* - this is *Water of Life* in Scottish Gaelic... and you've guessed it, whisky! I think we drank about five bottles across the six crew and because the race started at night we were pretty happy at breakfast!

What do you enjoy most about the sport?

I love being on the water and the challenge of the conditions.

What do you love about BYRA?

I love that it's a not-for-profit run by volunteers which keeps it so friendly and welcoming in comparison to the commercially run clubs. It's much easier to get to know people in this less formal family setting.

Can you tell me a vaguely interesting fact about yourself?

Well, I've lived and sailed in quite a few countries - Spain, Paris France for 16 months, and ten years in Phuket in Thailand. I opened a sailing school with two Americans but six weeks later the Boxing Day Tsunami hit! So that was the end of that!

Thank you Robb for being a wonderful interviewee, and we look forward to more 'meet the members' in the next edition!
